We will have our last ADV Synod meeting to affirm the start of the Diocese of the Mid Atlantic, then will have a brief first Synod meeting of the new diocese to elect a Standing Committee, and then will celebrate the investiture of our first bishop, John Guernsey. This day is a hugely significant one in our continuing development as a family, and I am really looking forward to the activities, as are many others. We are expecting over a dozen bishops to attend Bishop Guernsey's investiture, including Archbishop Duncan, Bishop Minns, and Bishop Bena. It will be a time of great joy, as well as a time of thanksgiving to God for the way He has blessed our efforts here in Virginia and the mid-Atlantic. We truly have much to be thankful for!

As we approach this great day, I remember back to our humble beginnings. It was only six years ago that as Truro Church's new Senior Warden, I was invited to attend a meeting of wardens and rectors of churches in the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia. That group had started meeting together periodically to try to find a way forward as a group in view of the turmoil that was tearing through the Episcopal Church. It is hard to describe what those early meetings were like – we were confused, angry (sometimes with each other), hurt, fearful, and uncertain as to direction, timing, and destination. We all knew that what we prayed for – an orthodox Anglican presence in North America – didn't exist at the time, and we weren't sure what to do next. We didn't even know what to call ourselves! But out of that group was ultimately born a Coalition, then the Anglican District of Virginia, and now the Anglican Diocese of the Mid-Atlantic. What a journey!


